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YE's approach – Young People

Young people from primary age onwards should be provided with real and relevant opportunities to develop and apply their skills and mindsets.

Beginning this process within the formative years of education establishes these positive mindsets at a critical point in a young person's development.



Importantly, these opportunities should continue into secondary education enabling progression, reinforcement and continued relevance.



YE's approach – Educators

The key influencers over a young person's mindset are their parents/carers and their teachers.

We recognise that the educators know the young people they work with the best. For this reason the vast majority of YE support is targeted at educators, enabling them to deliver appropriate and meaningful careers and enterprise education.

1 - here's a fiver!

Pupils will work together to decide what product or service they'll invest their fivers in



2 - getting started

Teams will need to source materials or products, prepare sales pitches, and plan selling events 6,278 primary young people in Wales participated in 2019/20



3 - keep it going

In the third week of the Challenge pupils get their product or service ready and prepare for their selling event



4 - payback and keep the profits

At the end of the Challenge pupils repay their £5 pledges plus a 50p legacy contribution and decide how to spend or donate their profit








My Money Week
