Why Accessibility in Careers Education Is Essential

- Holistic support nurtures confidence, self-advocacy, and readiness for adult life, including transitions to employment or supported living
- Narrow academic targets may overlook the broader needs essential for long-term wellbeing
- Reduces NEET risk, increases engagement
- Equality is a right, not a resource decision
- Improves life outcomes and uplifts communities.
- Reduces marginalisation
- Improves outcome for all learners





Where are we now?

- 1.7 million of students in England (18.4%) identified with SEND
- Schools fully implementing the Gatsby
 Benchmarks see an 8% reduction in NEET
 compared to those with low or no implementation
- Around a third (36%) of secondary school students do not feel confident in their next steps in education and training
- A survey by the National Education Union found that one-third of teachers lacked behaviour support for pupils with additional needs





Student-Centered Planning

- Actively gather student voice early and often.
 - Use surveys, focus groups, 1-1 chats etc to get their feedback and thoughts.
- Adapt based on ability and preferred learning methods
 - Use multiple formats for careers learning—so students can access content in ways that suit their individual needs.

Student centred approach does not mean 'letting students decide everything'- but **encourages ownership of their futures**

Tip: Don't wait until Year 11 to listen—early insight leads to earlier impact.






Inclusive use of Data

Where the holistic approach meets numbers

- A strong and accessible platform is important but the real impact comes from using the data to tailor support & guidance:
 - Analyse data by key demographics: SEND, EAL, etc.
 - Look for patterns: Are certain students disengaged, lacking confidence in certain skills, or unaware of available pathways?
- Using data will allow you to proactively offer guidance to students who may need it the most

Tip: Schedule time throughout the year to meaningfully review the data and action any insights






Bridging the Gap Between School and Home

- Parents and carers play a huge role in shaping a student's ideas and decisions about their future
- How are parents empowered to understand careers education?
- Think about launching a Parent portal & establishing a regular communication cadence
- Impact of engaging Parents & Carers: Build Trust and Shared Ownership of student outcomes

Tip: Create a careers FAQ sheet for parents to demystify key terms like T Levels, UCAS etc






Maximising Impact

Utilising Resources Effectively

- Train all staff to champion Careers
- Embed into curriculum
- Maximise your network & resources:
- Digital platforms, local partnerships, Enterprise Co ordinators, local colleges etc

Prip: Audit current tools/provision and identify gaps


