

Qualification in Career Development Student Destination Figures 2019

Introduction

This report covers those full time and part-time QCD students who completed their qualification in 2019.

Trends from 2018 to 2019

94 students completed the qualification in 2013, 92 in 2014, 138 in 2015, 105 in 2016, 128 in 2017, 130 in 2018 and 105 in 2019.

Compared to 2018 the number of students finding employment increased by 2% to 92%.

The number actively seeking work reduced by 2% to 3% and the number of students not actively seeking work decreased by 1% to 2%. There are also three students (3%) yet to complete their studies.

Of the 105 students in 2018, 56 studied at either Edinburgh Napier (28) or the University of the West of Scotland (27) and the majority (41 students) found work with SDS. Some students having being employed by SDS whilst they undertook the qualification on a part-time basis. One student was employed by Careers Wales during their studies.

The number of students finding work in secondary education decreased from 18% to 13% but those finding work in FE/6th Form Colleges increased from 5% to 8%.

Those finding work in HE institutions remained static at 14%. No students who completed in 2019 found work with the National Careers Service.

There was a decrease of 1% to 2 % for students finding work in other adult guidance agencies. The percentage finding employment in other voluntary sector guidance decreased by 1% to 1%. Private sector guidance decreased from 7% to 2&. One student found work abroad, three having found work abroad the year before.

Two students found employment as Enterprise Co-ordinators with the C&EC and two found work in Special Schools

One percent of students completing in 2019 found work in a non-career guidance role, a decrease of 3%.

Two students continued to further study in a career related area and another to further study in a non-career related area.

The tables below provide the details and also the percentage figures for the last six years.
