

# **Qualification in Career Development Student Destination Figures 2021**

# Introduction

This report covers those full time and part-time QCD students who completed their qualifications in 2021. There were no students completing the QCD at Canterbury Christ Church University in 2021 due to the validation of the new post-graduate programme.

# **Summary of QCD Student Destinations 2021**

### **Employed/Seeking Work**

Compared to 2020 the number of students finding employment increased by 3% to 96%. The number of students actively seeking work decreased by 3% to 2% and the number of students not actively seeking work stayed the same at 2%.

# **Career Development Roles**

Of the 125 students, 64 studied at either Edinburgh Napier University or the University of the West of Scotland and 32 found work with Skills Development Scotland (SDS). Some students have been employed by SDS whilst they undertook the qualification on a part-time basis.

Two students found employment with the Careers Service in Northern Ireland.

The number of students finding work in secondary education decreased from 25% to 16%, this is back in line with previous years. Those finding work in FE/6th Form Colleges stayed the same at 4%. The number of students finding work with local authorities increased by 4% to 6%.

Those finding work in HE institutions decreased by 2% to 17%. One student who completed in 2021 found work with the National Careers Service.

The percentage finding employment in other voluntary sector guidance decreased by 2% to 4%. There was an increase of other Adult guidance 2% to 4%. Private sector guidance returned to 2% an increase of 1% in 2020.

The number finding work abroad increased from 2 % to 3%. 4% of students found work in the charities sector and social enterprises.

# **Non-Career Development Roles**

14% of students completing in 2021 found work in a non-career guidance role, an increase of 7%

Ten students continued to further study in a career development subject, eight of these ten students are in employment and two students chose to study in non-career related areas.
