

The disability employment rate was 53.6% in Q2 2023, compared to 82.5% for non-disabled people.

The rising number of people classed as disabled is associated with an increase in people reporting mental health conditions

One in three Disabled workers are working part-time





Over 1.5 million pupils in England have special educational needs (SEN) An increase of 87,000 from 2022. Both the number of pupils with an education, health and care (EHC plan) and the number of pupils with SEN support have increased:

- The percentage of pupils with an EHC plan has increased to 4.3%, from 4.0% in 2022.
- The percentage of pupils with SEN but no EHC plan (SEN support) has increased to 13.0%, from 12.6% in 2022.
- Both continue a trend of increases since 2016.

The most common type of need for those with an EHC plan is autistic spectrum condition and for those with SEN support is speech, language and communication needs
