Ontario Ministry of Education Mandate

Key goal of the Adult Education Strategy

"To support the commitment made in "Achieving Excellence... ...to ensure that the adult education system better supports adult learners in their efforts to finish high school and successfully transition to postsecondary education, training or the workplace."





What is adult and continuing education in Ontario?

A&CE programs are flexible and include different supports for adult learners.

Targeted to enable adult learners to achieve their learning and or employment goals.

A&CE programs in Ontario school boards include:

- credit courses leading to a high school diploma,
- language support programs literacy and academic upgrading to help people transition to credit,
- employment to post-secondary to apprenticeship or to independence.

Sector specific training programs are offered in various boards.

The Ontario Adult Education Strategy

The four key areas in scope for the Adult Education Strategy

Regionally Coordinated Access to Flexible Delivery	Access to coordinated information, intake, assessment, and referrals
Regionally coordinated access to consistent Prior Learning Assessment and Recognition (PLAR)	Regional guidance, career counselling and pathway planning

Challenges!

- Lack of internet infrastructure, lack of transportation
- No standardized intake or referral processes across region
- Adult education seen as "second cousin" to K-12
- Stigma of returning to adult education
- Complicated funding envelopes
- Compassion fatigue
- Competitive boards

Overcoming the challenges!

We valued the following:

- A culture of care, rooted within a holistic approach to learning.
- **Diverse learners,** with unique qualities.
- *Flexible approaches,* to support learning.
- **Provision of service,** within local communities.
- **Community partnerships,** that enhance service.
- **Pathway planning** to support the acquisition of an OSSD and/or successful transitions.
- Innovation and creativity, that facilitate continuous improvement.

Year One: What we achieved



- Creation of regional partnership

 - Interviews with 63 staff
- Develop multi-year strategic plan
